Book with one author	Format:	Author last name, First name. <i>Title</i> . Publisher, Year of publication.

Reference Book (Encyclopedia)	Format:	Author last name, first name. "Title of the essay." <i>Title of Encyclopedia</i> . Ed. Editor's name(s). Volume. Place of Publisher, Page range of entry.
	<i>Example:</i>	James, Jesse. "The Wild West." <i>Cowboy Encyclopedia</i> , vol. 5, Rawhide Press, pp. 11-34.
Magazine article	Format:	Author(s). "Title of article." <i>Title of Magazine</i> , Day Month Year, pages.
	<i>Example:</i>	Hackworth, Col. David H. "Terms of Forgiveness." <i>Newsweek</i> . 24 Apr. 2005, 38-40.
Journal or Scholarly journal	Format:	Author(s). "Article title." <i>Journal name</i> . Volume, Issue, Year, pages.
	<i>Example:</i>	Stoddard, Sarah, Babara McMorris, and Renee Sieving. "Do Social Connections and Hope Matter in Predicting Early Adolescent Violence?" <i>American Journal of Community Psychology</i> , vol. 4, no. 3, 2011, pp. 247-56.
Newspaper article	Format:	Author(s). "Article title." <i>Newspaper name</i> . Day month year, edition, page numbers.
	<i>Example:</i>	Ruane, Michael E. "Fossil Fueled: Peter Kranz is Hot on the Cold Trail of a Dinosaur." <i>The Washington Post</i> . 11 April 2002: C1+.
Personal interview	Format:	Interview subject(s) name. Kind of interview (personal, telephone, etc.). Day month year.
	<i>Example:</i>	Silk, Karan. Personal interview. 29 Jan. 1995.
Film or Movie (recorded)	Format:	<i>Title</i> . Director. Film studio or distributor, Year of release.
	<i>Example:</i>	<i>It's a Wonderful Life</i> . Dir. Frank Capra. Republic, 1998.
Television or Radio Program	Format:	"Episode Title." <i>Program title</i> . Network name, call letters, city, date of broadcast.
	<i>Example:</i>	"The Blessing Way." <i>The X-Files</i> . Fox. WFLD, Chicago, 19 July 2011.
Song or Album Recording	Format:	Artist name(s). "Song Title." <i>Album name</i> . Recording manufacturer, publication date.
	<i>Example:</i>	Nirvana. "Smells Like Teen Spirit." <i>Nevermind</i> . Geffen, 1991.

Website <i>Omit author if none is listed</i>	Format: Editor, author, or compiler name. <i>Name of site</i> . Version, Name of institution affiliated with the site, Date of posting/creation, URL, DOI, or permalink. Date of access.
	Example: ALA. American Library Association, 2011, www.ala.org . Accessed 29 January 2009.
Page on a Website	Format: Author. "Title of page." <i>Website name</i> , URL. Date accessed.
	Example: Lundman, Susan. "How to Make Vegetarian Chili." eHow, www.ehow.com/how_10727_make-vegetarian-chili.html . Accessed 6 July 2015.
Online Magazine <i>Web magazines</i> <i>Use n.p. if no publisher listed and n.d. if no publishing date listed</i>	Format: Author(s) name. "Title of article." <i>Name of web magazine</i> , Publisher name, publication date (day month year), URL, Date of access (day month year).
	Example: Edwards, Gavin. "Ashton Kutcher." <i>Rolling Stone</i> , Rolling Stone, 29 May 2010, www.rollingstone.com , 10 June 2010.
Database Article <i>ProQuest, Biography in Context, Opposing Viewpoints, American Government, American History, World Book Encyclopedia, Science in Context, Issues and Controversies, EBSCO, etc.</i>	Format: Author(s) name. "Title of work." <i>Article's original source</i> , volume, number, Date of publication, pages. <i>Name of database</i> , URL or DOI, Date accessed (day month year).
	Example: Langhamer, Claire. "Love and Courtship in Mid-Twentieth-Century England." <i>Historical Journal</i> , vol. 50, no. 1, 2007, pp. 173-96. <i>ProQuest</i> , doi:10.1017/S0018246X06005966. Accessed 27 May 2009.
YouTube Video	Format: Author. "Title of Video." <i>Site</i> , Date accessed, URL.
	Example: "8 Hot Dog Gadgets put to the Test." YouTube, uploaded by Crazy Russian Hacker, 6 June 2016, www.youtube.com/watch?v=WB'pjSEtELs .
Blog Posting, Listservs, Discussion groups	Format: Editor, screen name, author, or compiler name (if available). "Posting Title." <i>Name of site</i> , Version number (if available), Name of institution/organization affiliated (sponsor or publisher), URL. Date of access.
	Example: Canobbio, Tara. "Say Yes to CS During CSEdWeek." <i>The Official Google Blog</i> . Google, Inc. Accessed 5 December 2011.
Tweet	Format: Twitter handle. "Tweet you are quoting." <i>Site</i> , date, time, URL.
	Example: @tombrokaw. "SC demonstrated why all the debates are the engines of this campaign." <i>Twitter</i> , 22 Jan. 2012, 3:06 a.m., twitter.com/tombrokaw/status/160996868971704320 .
Map or Chart	Format: Author(s). <i>Title of the work</i> . Descriptive label. Publication city: Publisher. Publication medium.
	Example: <i>Michigan</i> . Map. Chicago: Rand, 2000. Print.
