- Arrange the items on your reference list alphabetically by author, interfiling books, articles, etc.
- Double-space all lines.
- Indent the second and following lines 5 spaces

Encyclopedia	Format:	Author last name, first name. (Year of publication). Name of encyclopedia (volume, pages). Location, Publisher.
	Example:	Bergmann, P. G. (1993). Relativity. In <i>The new encyclopedia Britannica</i> (Vol. 26, pp. 501-508). Chicago: Encyclopedia Britannica.
Organization written book	Format:	Name of association or organization. (Year).
	Example:	American Psychological Association. (2003).
Magazine article – with author	Format:	Author last name, first name, Author last name, first name, & Author, first name. (Publication date). Title of article. <i>Title of Periodical</i> , volume number (issue number), pages.
	Example:	Henry, W. A., III. (1990, April 9). Making the grade in today's schools. <i>Time</i> , 135, 28-31.
Journal or Scholarly journal	Format:	Author last name, first name. (Year of publication). Title of article. <i>Title of periodical</i> , volume number, pages.
	Example:	Harlow, H. F. (1983). Fundamentals for preparing psychology journal articles. <i>Journal of Comparative and Physiological Psychology</i> , <i>55</i> , 893-896.
Newspaper article with author	Format:	Author last name, first name. (Date of publication). Title of article. <i>Title of newspaper</i> , pages.
	Example:	Schultz, S. (2005, December 28). Calls made to strengthen state energy policies. <i>The Country Today</i> , pp. 1A, 2A.
Letter to the editor	Format:	Author last name, first name. (Date of publication). Title of article [Letter to the editor]. <i>Title of publication</i> , volume, pages.
	Example:	Moller, G. (2002, August). Ripples versus rumbles [Letter to the editor]. <i>Scientific American, 287</i> (2), 12.

Ebook	Format:	Authors last name, first name. Title of book. Retrieved from website address.
	Example:	De Huff, E. W. <i>Taytay's tales: Traditional Pueblo Indian tales</i> .  Retrieved from <a href="http://digital.library.upenn.edu/women/dehuff/taytay/">http://digital.library.upenn.edu/women/dehuff/taytay/</a> .
Videocassette or DVD	Format:	Producer, P. P. (Producer), & Director, D. D. (Director). (Date of publication). <i>Title of motion picture</i> [Motion picture]. Country of origin: Studio or distributor.
	Example:	Weiner, Jake. (Producer), & Tucker, Anand. (Director). (2010). <i>Leap Year</i> [Motion picture]. USA: Universal Studios.
Television Program	Format:	Producer, P. P. (Producer). (Date of broadcast or copyright).  Title of broadcast [ <i>Television broadcast or Television series</i> ]. City of origin: Studio or distributor.

Web site	Format:	Author, A. A., & Author, B. B. (Date of publication). <i>Title of document</i> . Retrieved from http://Web address.

Magazine or journal article from an online database	Format:	Authors last name, first name. (Date of publication). Title of article. <i>Title of periodical</i> , volume, pages. Retrieved from name of database, publisher of database. Retrieved from database website.
